

Dr. Jesse R. Peel

Originally from Everetts, North Carolina, Dr. Jesse R. Peel graduated from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, where he attended medical school. He then completed his residency in psychiatry at the University of Pennsylvania. A resident of Atlanta since 1976, Jesse was at the forefront of HIV/ AIDS advocacy efforts and served as a founding member of several activist groups.

J. Woolard Peel, Jesse's father, believed that East Carolina University represented the future of eastern North Carolina. Jesse's philanthropic engagement with ECU dates back to 1986. His landmark gift in 2014 established what is now the Dr. Jesse R. Peel LGBTQ Center, the largest center of its kind in the UNC System.

The Dr. Jesse R. Peel LGBTQ Center sees more than 7,000 visits each academic year. Fundraising efforts support the LGBTQ Priority Fund, which provides scholarships and professional development opportunities for students. Center programs include a film series, a speaker series and annual events such as National Coming Out Day, Transgender Day of Remembrance and World AIDS Day.

Dr. Marilyn Sheerer served as provost and vice chancellor of the University of North Carolina Wilmington from 2015 until 2020. She was provost of East Carolina University[®] from 2007 until August 2014. Prior to that, she was dean of the ECU College of Education for eight years. Before ECU, she was a department chair at Edinboro University

in Pennsylvania and Northern Illinois University. Dr. Sheerer was instrumental in helping to found what was then the LGBT Resource Office at ECU in 2011.
